The cornerstone is the Old Course Cannes Mandelieu, founded in 1891 by Grand Duke Michael of Russia, which established the region as a premier winter golfing destination.

Other prestigious clubs followed shortly after (Valescure-1895, Mougins-1923) and golf became a permanent attraction for those seeking to play in the sun.
